

Finding Connection & Creativity at HCA

Sawyer Davidson is in her fourth year of class at HCA, studying acting in the HCA Theatre School. Having graduated through Junior, Intermediate, and now in Teen Acting, this emerging theatre and film actor shares some thoughts about finding her voice at HCA and her growth as an actor.

Q: What's your favourite part about studying acting?

A: I feel like everywhere else it's hard to connect with people, but here it's different. Everybody likes the same thing. I can connect with them because we all have acting in common. We all want to do great plays, learn about theatre, and just be big theatre people together.

Q: What do you love most about acting and performing?

A: I like that I can understand people better. When I play different characters, I get to relate to them and explore their personalities – it's like stepping into someone else's world.

Q: What are some of your favourite roles you've played at HCA?

A: Last year I played the Award-

Winning Diva in The Ghost Light, which my mom says really suits me. I went so overboard with it, and it was so fun! I also loved being a Hippie in The Almost Complete History of the Universe.

Q: You've also done a fair amount of film work. What is that like?

A: I've done three short films and one documentary. My favourite was Mica. It's creepy but fun. I played a little girl who believes in fairies, which I loved because I really do believe in magic.

Q: How has HCA helped you grow as an actor?

A: It's taught me to stay committed and not break the fourth wall (unless it's on purpose!). It's also helped me blend techniques for both stage and camera work.

A: I love writing! I'm working on a ghost story right now. I also paint, sing, and dance with my friends. I used to do cheerleading, and at recess we even practice lifts on the grass.

A: It has such a creative vibe. We're theatre kids, so we make the most of it – whether it's props, cool architecture, or just the energy of the room, it all inspires us to create something together.






